    - § We received a contract from Kennedy Construction for the construction and project management. Our internal team is meeting on Monday with Trevor to review the contract and decide next steps to move forward.

# **Treasurer's Report** (Kelly K)

- Since our last PAC meeting, we have received our BC gaming grant of \$16,480 which is based on \$20 per student.
- · We now have just over \$120,000 in cash between our general account, gaming account and trust accounts.
- · We have spent \$975 on deposits for the November 25<sup>th</sup> parent social/fundraiser and close to \$2,400 on the Outdoor Gathering Space. We have also reimbursed costs of \$158 related to the Grade 8 Welcome Breakfast.

#### **DPAC Report** (Amit)

The district PAC meeting was held on October 4<sup>th</sup>. Amit was there as the rep for Rockridge. It was 2 hours long.

- Generally, they had an update from the district that was about the WV enhanced learning.
- Discussion on secondary school dances. If parents or secondary school students want to work to set up at dance, contact Gleneagles community centre.
- Students can become lifeguard certified. There is a community centre course and they are looking for volunteers to get certified. The community centre wants students to know that they need more students to work as lifeguards.
- Students who participate in the FAST program this leads to the possibility of other employment options.
- End of the meeting, there was a Q+A section. About 15 parents stood up and made it clear they did not agree with the West Vancouver School Districts approach to SOGI education. These parents were shouting and angry about the situation. As the DPAC rep for Rockridge, Amit wants to be very clear about Rockridge's stance on the SOGI topic. Sachi asked that PAC put out some sort of education on what SOGI is and the districts position. Chris Kennedy sent out an email to all parents on October 30th that provides clarification and resources to parents on this topic.

#### 1) Communications

- Raven Life we have started to share pictures of the kids. The other thing we have done really well is adding that parent voice into it so that the PAC isn't just about 1 meeting per month.
- Social media we have 4 accounts that are keeping parents up to date. Our X and Instagram accounts are managed by admin. Our athletic social media accounts are managed by the athletic teachers.

### 2) Google Classroom

- Google classroom serves as the students binder.
- It is a tool for students and parents. Parents support their kids by sitting down shoulder to shoulder with them to review what is due. Make the time to sit down with your kids and Google Classroom. A great place to look is their grad year for outside the timetable career information.

### 3) FIT

- · FIT block is an improvement from Block 5.
- Grade 8 9 and 10 stay in their classroom for FIT. Sometimes they have career life scheduled during FIT.
- Grade 11 and 12 can use any spaces in the school for FIT.

- The cafeteria is closed at 10:45 10 min before FIT starts so they don't grab a snack before fit.
