Our School

Rockridge Secondary School is a co-ed grade 8-12 public high school founded in 1996 in the municipality of West Vancouver. Rockridge is an authorized International Baccalaureate World School where all students in Grades 8-10 participate in the IB Middle Years Programme. Rockridge also offers a range of Advanced Placement (AP) courses to give students a head start on their post-secondary studies. The total enrollment this year is 829 students. Our students travel daily from islands, coastal inlets, the sea to-sky corridor, North Vancouver and West Vancouver. The current graduating class of 175 students, comprises a diverse range of cultures, socioeconomic status, parental education backgrounds and career aspirations. Adding to our student diversity are our international students which make up approximately 9% of our total student population. Our enrollment is down this year due to reduced numbers of international students and changing demographics of the school catchment. As a result, students have had fewer course choices because of timetable conflicts.

Mission Statement

The School Calendar

In 2020/21, we moved from a linear school timetable to a quarterly system to provide more flexibility during the pandemic. In 2021/22 we changed the timetable to a semester system where students typically took four courses per semester with some of our career and fine arts courses being offered over the entire year. In 2022/23 we continued on a semester based timetable. In 2023/24 we then returned to a linear timetable where students are now taking all courses, typically 8, over the entire school year. In this linear model there are three terms over a 36-week school year. Marks will be provided as follows:

Term 1: Sep. 05 - Nov. 24 (marks published on Dec. 1)

Term 2: Nov. 27 - Mar. 1 (marks published on Mar. 8)

Term 3: Mar. 04 - Jun. 25 (marks published on June 27)

Classes meet five times in a two-week cycle for 175 class days per year. Classes are between 60 to 80 minutes long. Students also have the opportunity during Flexible Instructional Time to work independently or collaboratively with the support of their teachers on Monday and Thursday mornings for 50 minutes.

Graduation Requirements

To complete the BC Certificate of Graduation, or Dogwood Diploma, students must complete at least 80 credits; including English Language Arts 10, 11 and 12 (total of 12 credits), Math 10 and 11 or 12 (8 credits total), Science 10 and 11 or 12 (8 credits total), Social Studies 10 and 12 (8 credits total), PE 10 (4 credits), one Fine Arts or Applied Skills 10-12 (4 credits), Careers 10 and 12 (8 credits total), and 30 hours of experiential learning. In addition, students must also complete three formal provincial graduation assessments including grade 10 numeracy and grade 10 and 12 literacy. At least 16 credits must be at the grade 12 level, including the required Language Arts 12 course and the Career-Life Connections Course.

Marking System

Rockridge uses an unweighted 100-point system. Students are graded on proficiency-based rubrics which are then converted to a percentage grade. The following is a list of British Columbia Ministry of Education authorized final letter grades for all courses listed on report cards and transcripts. The GPA equivalent, on a 4.0 scale, is listed for the purpose of US university information only:

Honour Roll / Awards

Honour Roll is achieved with a GPA of 79.5 to 85.4. Honours with Distinction is achieved with a GPA of 85.5 to 100. Calculations are based on courses taken within the West Vancouver School District and on a student's best marks on 6 of 8 courses taken in their final year. No "F" or "IE" standings are allowed; only courses with letter grades assigned are eligible to be included. The Prestige Award is given to two Rockridge students in each grade who have shown outstanding excellence in academics, fine arts or sports and leadership. The Principal's Award is given to two Rockridge students in each grade who have shown leadership and community spirit in clubs or activities in and outside of the school.

Enriched Courses

Rockridge offered fewer enriched programs over the last two years due to Covid-19, changes in the timetable as well as a decrease in school enrollment. Several AP courses overlap so students need to pick and choose which AP courses they will take. Because of this reduced AP offering, grade 12 students are prioritized. AP Courses are unweighted.
