# **VIRTUAL PARENT-TEACHER INTERVIEWS**

We are once again using an online Parent-Teacher Interview scheduling program (<u>http://rss.schoolappointments.com</u>). Access to the system opens at 6:00 pm on Thursday, January 11 and will close at 10:00pm on Monday, January 22. You will be able to create an account, enter your children and then schedule interview times for you to meet with their teachers virtually. Please review <u>these instructions</u> to set up your account and book appointments

Appointment scheduling will run in five-minute intervals. It is advisable to schedule your appointments with one five-minute block in between, to allow yourself time and not be rushed. **There is a maximum of three appointments per student up until January 18**, then you will be able to book additional spots pending availability. Due to a limited number of timeslots, please prioritize your teacher selections accordingly. There is not an option for call backs this year.

The system is very easy to use and it should take only a few minutes to set up your account, add your children and schedule your appointments. To get started, click on the "REGISTER" tab. See the attachment for detailed instructions. On the day of the appointments - please review <u>these instructions</u> for how to access the meetings through google meet.

#### THIS WEEK'S MYP MOMENT

At Rockridge, students are encouraged to connect what they're learning in the classroom to real-world settings, events and circumstances. One of the ways that students can do this in the MYP is through the exploration of the Global Contexts—themes which help teachers and students answer the important question, "Why are we learning this?"

In the MYP, the six Global Contexts are:

- Identities and Relationships: Who am I? Who are we?
- Orientation in Space and Time: What is the meaning of "where" and "when"?
- Personal and Cultural Expression: What is the nature and purpose of creative expression?
- Scientific and Technical Innovation: How do we understand the world in which we live?
- Globalization and Sustainability: How is everything connected?
- Fairness and Development: What are the consequences of our common humanity?

Think about how these contexts may appear in your own daily conversations, thoughts and musings. How are these contexts related, and relevant, to what you do at work? At home? Out and about in the community?

You can hear more about these contexts at our annual Personal Project Exhibition on Thursday, February 8th, where the Grade 10s will be showcasing their wide range of passion projects. The projects will be arranged based on contexts, so you'll be able to see how students have applied these themes to their own learning. We can't wait to see you there!
