THIS WEEK'S MYP MOMENT

This week, we'd like to give a big round of applause to three students who were invited to present at this month's West Van Board of Education Meeting. Students were asked to reflect on their Grade 10 Personal Project, and consider how the experience allowed them to develop transferable skills that could then be applied to their graduating Capstone Project in Grade 12.

- **Bjorn (Grade 10):** For his Personal Project, Bjorn set out to make a mini documentary on what it was like to attend school in Denmark. Through his project, Bjorn was able to learn more about his heritage and form meaningful connections with other students, as well as further develop his interviewing and video-editing skills.
- Finnan (Grade 12): Finnan's Capstone Project traces his journey in leadership, communitybuilding and athletics. He connected this to the communication and self-management skills he developed in the MYP, which culminated in the creation of an adjustable camping table that was inspired by one that his grandfather owned.
- Lauren (Grade 12): Lauren's Personal and Capstone projects showcase her woodworking skills, as she's now handcrafted both a wooden pallet and garden planter. These projects are a reflection of her passion for the environment and sustainability, which she continues to advocate for through the school's Environment Club.

We love seeing how the MYP can set our students up for success, and a passion for learning, beyond the programme, and this was wonderfully highlighted in the students' presentations to the Board. FAST (FIRST AID SWIM TRAINING) - Applications for the 2024-2025 school year are NOW OPEN

FAST is a young lifeguard education program that allows students to develop the essential skills to be successful and confident lifeguards. At the completion of the FAST program students will have obtained

all the required certification prerequisites necessary to enroll in the National Lifeguard Course, which students can take independently when they are 15 years of age or older. Completion of the National Lifeguard Course is the final credential necessary to qualify an individual to work as a lifeguard.

In addition to developing strong first aid skills, the FAST program also focuses on providing students with a practical foundation in resistance and cardiovascular training, swimming, stroke-development, and leadership.

Cybersecurity and Artificial Intelligence

Computer Information Systems 12 - Cybersecurity and Artificial Intelligence, one of the West Vancouver Schools Premier Programs, is a hands-on project-based course offered to students in Grades 11 and 12 who are attending Rockridge, Sentinel or West Van Secondary. Students learn the theory and apply it to practical projects in the fields of Cybersecurity and Artificial Intelligence. Students have an opportunity to prepare for external certifications in Cybersecurity, Networking, Internet of Things, Programming, CompTIA, and Data Science and participate in international competitions such as <u>CyberPatriot</u>, <u>Desmos</u> <u>Math Art Contest</u>, and others. The course aims at helping students prepare material they can use for university applications.
