# A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

I appreciate the time you take each week to scroll down through our weekly E-Bulletin to stay informed about our Rockridge school community. This week, we officially started learning period 3, the final term of this school year. While this messaging might prompt some folks to start thinking about the end of June, I prefer to help students focus on shorter timelines and specific goals and objectives. For example, tomorrow students and parents/guardians will be able to access the second learning update (formerly

known as report cards) for the Rockridge student(s) in your household. This is an important opportunity for students and families to:

- Schedule a dedicated time when you can sit down together to review the report card without distractions.
- Check in on growth since learning update one. This includes reflecting on not just marks, but comments made by teachers.
- Celebrate accomplishments and strengths. Our students are dedicated to their learning and planning for the future, but pausing to recognize their milestones both big and small provides inspiration and positivity.
- Identify areas for growth and improvement. Ask your student to open their Grad Class Google Classroom and review their ATL Student Self-Reflections. Our students are already goal setting and reflecting with each learning update, however, there may be other plans of action that can be discussed and created together as a family as well.
- Follow up with a teacher when there are questions or uncertainties. Our Raven students know a lot about their learning, but when they are not sure about a comment or mark on the learning update, they should be communicating with their teacher a good time to do so is during FIT Block on Mondays and Thursdays..

This week's MYP Moment from Ms. LeSieur and Ms. Millare below once again provides some helpful reminders (and RE-reminders!) for Grade 8 to 10 families as you navigate the learning update.

#### THIS WEEK'S MYP MOMENT

This is the week, parents! You will be able to access the second "Learning Update" (the new name for report cards) on MyEd on **Friday, March 8th, 2024** for the Rockridge student(s) in your household.

Here are a few reminders as you navigate the learning update:

## 1) What the Levels Mean in Grades 8 - 10

The MYP Levels are aligned with the new BC Proficiency Scale. So if you see a Level of 4 for a specific criterion, it does NOT mean that your student received a 4 out of 8. It means the following:

Levels 1 - 2	Levels 3 - 4	Levels 5 - 6	Levels 7 - 8
Demonstrates an initial understanding of the expected learning.	Demonstrates a partial understanding of the expected learning.	Demonstrates a complete understanding of the expected learning.	Demonstrates a sophisticated understanding of the expected learning.

A passing level in a course is considered a 2.

If a 1 or an IE (insufficient evidence) is present, students will be given a supportive action plan to help get them back on track in the remainder of the course. You will receive this from the teacher.

#### 2) Learning Takes Time

Perhaps your student isn't content with the levels they are receiving at this time. Remind them that growing and learning takes time. They will not remain at these levels if they're willing to reflect on what has been and make some plans to lean into the spaces that need attention.

#### 3) Look for the Teacher Comments not the IB Generated Comments

Lastly, we're going to encourage you to ignore the generic IB comments that are generated based on levels and instead look to the specifics from your teacher comment (it will be indicated where it begins). The comments that are auto-generated from IB for the MYP program are in the lengthy process of being updated on a global scale, and currently, the language does not align with where BC Assessment is moving to. So, ignore them!

Look at the teacher's comment first. They know and can give the best feedback on your student.

We hope these reminders are helpful to you as you navigate the second learning update of the year.

Course selection sessions have now been completed by all grades with our counsellors and admin team.
