# **Vaping Information from WV Schools**

Vaping has continued to decline in our schools, and we are committed to ensuring school environments are tobacco and vape free. However, we know that vaping still occurs. In addition to ongoing student education, our schools regularly monitor and supervise all school spaces and post visuals in our schools reminding students that our facilities are vape free.

One of the ways we would like to support our families and youth in learning more about vaping is partnering with Foundry for an upcoming series entitled "Youth & Vaping – Information, Considerations & Impacts" on June 12<sup>th</sup> at Rockridge Secondary.

This evening event will be led by keynote speakers: Lindsay MacDonald and Lauren Wilkinson, both of whom have extensive knowledge surrounding the world of youth and vaping. Topics to be discussed will include:

- Youth vaping rates
- Stats
- Products
- Industry influence
- Health impacts including addiction
- local support for youth.

#### THIS WEEK'S MYP MOMENT

Last week, we started our journey through the Learner Profile, which consists of the 10 traits that represent the qualities of successful citizens we would hope all our learners grow to become. Last week, we took a look at the characteristic: Knowledgeable.

This week, we're going to continue our journey with the Learner Profile characteristic: **Inquirer** Learners who are inquirers are genuinely curious about the world and life around them. They love to investigate and use a wide variety of tools to do so. Inquirers love to learn, and they continue to do so throughout their lives beyond the classroom!

If you would like to know a bit more about what it means for a learner to be an inquirer, you can find a video introduction here.

How can you help your learners grow to be inquirers at home?

- Encourage your students' interests by researching together and accessing resources (libraries, museums, provincial parks, etc.) that allow you to delve into the topics!
- Model wonder for your students! Not everything has to have an instant answer. Ask questions. Develop discussion.
- Admit when you don't have an answer to something! Model the steps you should take, when you need help with something.
- Ask your Rockridge learners about the information they're taking in, not only from school, but
  the internet, TV shows, movies and social media platforms too! Work with them to help them
  understand that not all information is from reputable sources or depicts how things really are in
  the world.

Once logged in, parents have the option to either update a P+P form created last year or start a new one.

Please be aware that a new P+P consent form MUST be completed for each student, each school year. Permissions expire on August 31 each year. The form includes consent for the following:

- Student Code of Conduct and Discipline
- District Network and Internet Appropriate Use
- Privately Owned Electronic Devices Appropriate Use
- Use of Website Applications Outside British Columbia Parental Consent
- Media, Digital Media, and Video Release
- Community Activities Release Parental Consent
- Consent of Release Permission
