This week, we're going to look at the Learner Profile characteristic: Balanced

How much balance do we have in our lives these days? Is your student good at balance? Are YOU? Learners who are balanced understand the importance of giving intentional time and focus to various aspects of their lives. Well-being for the whole person involves the brain, the body and the soul! Balanced individuals give quality time to their work, their play, their inward journey and their important relationships. They understand all aspects of their lives have equal importance.

How can you help your learners grow to be balanced at home?

- Help your learner (or family) create a daily schedule that includes time for schoolwork, play, meals and quality rest.
- Model balance in your own life for your learner: work, play, exercise, eat properly, connect with others, rest
- Encourage your learner to try new things but help them understand how to incorporate them into or modify their current schedule.
- During less structured time, be aware of the activities your learner is choosing to participate in.
 All people should try to do a variety of things. A lot of just one thing is generally never too good for people.

For example, too much screen time? Go outside for a walk.

Lots of activities? Take time to read or draw, etc.

Physics and Math Excellence - Rockridge Student; Warren B. - see photo in Raven Life

In preparation for representing Canada at the International Mathematical Olympiad, Warren B. (Gr. 10) has been invited by the Canadian Mathematical Society and the Mathematical Association of America to the Mathematical Olympiad Program 2024 at Carnegie Mellon University in June. Before that, he will attend the Canadian Computing Olympiad at the University of Waterloo later this month. Leading up to this, Warren has been the back-to-back champion of the International Mathematical Olympiad.

The esteemed CAP (Canadian Association of Physics) Contest, held on April 10th nationwide, was tackled by senior-level high school students from across Canada. This examination underscores the importance of logical reasoning and innovative problem-solving, surpassing standard classroom expectations. Prizes await outstanding performers at both provincial and national levels. Four students from Rockridge rose to the challenge, among them was Warren B, who secured an impressive 5th place in Canada. This accomplishment is particularly noteworthy as Warren is currently in 10th grade.

Youth Ambassadors Program Scholarship Recipient - Rockridge Student; Maria L

Special congratulations go to grade 11 student Maria L., who was just accepted on full scholarship, into the highly competitive Youth Ambassadors Program, run by the US State Department; there are only 12 places available for Canadian students.

Maria will travel to Washington DC for three weeks this summer where she will network with international students from all over the Americas to engage in experiential learning activities, leadership training, civic participation at the community level, mentoring by community, business, and NGO leaders, and volunteering. Program themes include social inclusion, entrepreneurship, innovation, and environmental protection. When she returns home, she will be tasked with implementing a community service project under the guidance of the Youth Ambassadors' staff.

Rockridge Student to represent Canada on U21 Junior Men's National Field Hockey Team

Rockridge Student, Christopher C. has made the U21 Junior Men's National Field Hockey Team & will be representing Canada at the upcoming Pan Am Championship games in July in Surrey.
