THIS WEEK'S MYP MOMENT

Last week, we continued our journey through the Learner Profile, which consists of the 10 traits that represent the qualities of successful citizens we would hope all our learners grow to become. Last week, we looked at the characteristic: Caring. This week, we are going to look at the Learner Profile characteristic: **Reflective.**

Reflective learners have a strong sense of self. They know their skillset and they also know the areas that have room for growth. Where there is space for growth, they are unafraid to make changes, are open to feedback, and take steps to make things better for themselves.

How can <u>you</u> help your learners grow to be reflective at home?

- Take time to review their learning updates with them. Learners should have the opportunity to review and consider the implications of the document. When discussing with them, be open to considering the beliefs they have surrounding their strengths and areas for growth.
- Work with your learner to set realistic goals for the learning that is ahead of them. Help them
 understand the specific actions they should take to actually take steps to work towards their
 goals. And set dates for when you will check in to discuss and reflect on how things are actually
 going.
- Consider clear goals you can set for yourself that you can work on alongside your learner too and involve them in the discussion and reflection of these goals as appropriate.

Know who else are reflective learners?

Our own Rockridge teachers! They have spent time this morning reflecting on the MYP assessment practices they currently have in place and are considering and developing ones that focus on skill development and clarity for students. Teachers so long to help ALL our learners have a strong understanding of their true skills, how they can clearly apply them in their various subject tasks and where they can extend themselves.

In addition, the International Baccalaureate as the organization that oversees the Middle Years Program is very intentional about modelling good reflection practices. They make regular efforts to set goals, collect data, reflect and adjust to meet best practices accordingly. As MYP Coordinators, we are also

spending time today working with other MYP coordinators from schools in the lower mainland learning about how the IB is working towards best practices using student feedback and considering the ongoing rise of AI.

Undoubtedly, reflection abounds at ALL levels of our learning, living, working, and growing at Rockridge!

Tour for Humanity - June 3rd & 6th - Social Studies

Gr. 10 Social Justice, Political Science, and History students will be participating in a one-hour lesson in a giant mobile classroom bus that will be onsite at Rockridge.

The workshop begins with a screening of FSWC's three-part documentary series titled The Holocaust, Universal Genocide and Real-World Heroes. The documentary is followed by a discussion of The Ten Stages of Genocide, focusing on the Holocaust and other genocides, including in Rwanda and Cambodia, and crimes against humanity in Ukraine and Eastern Europe committed by the former Soviet Union under dictator Joseph Stalin.
