A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Learning Updates for Term One will be published in MyEd for all students in just two weeks time. This translates into a busy time for both students and staff as they prepare for the end of this first learning period of the school year. One of the actions all students need to take and complete each learning period is their ATL reflection. To help students and parents understand these self-reflections and the importance of them, I have included some helpful information below.

Understanding IB MYP ATL Reflections and Their Importance in the BC Curriculum

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme (MYP) emphasizes the development of students as independent learners through its Approaches to Learning (ATL) framework. ATL skills focus on the following 5 key areas as they relate to a student's learning: thinking, communication, social skills, research skills and self-management skills.

What Are ATL Reflections?

ATL reflections are a critical component of the MYP IB program at Rockridge, where students regularly reflect on their learning processes and the development of their ATL skills. These reflections encourage students to think about how they learn, identify their strengths and areas for improvement, and set goals for future learning. This is a reflective practice that encourages a growth mindset amongst our students and promotes lifelong learning habits

Importance of ATL Reflections in the BC Curriculum

In British Columbia (BC), the curriculum emphasizes **competency-based learning**, which aligns closely with the IB MYP's focus on ATL skills.

How are the ATL Reflections implemented in classrooms at Rockridge?

Integrating IB MYP ATL reflections into the BC curriculum enhances students' learning experiences by promoting self-awareness, critical thinking, communication, personalized learning, and resilience. These reflections not only support academic success but also prepare students to be thoughtful, adaptable, and proactive individuals in their future endeavours. At Rockridge, we provide space and time for all of our students to complete their ATL reflections by attaching their goals for growth to meaningful and relevant activities within each course's subject matter. The ATL reflections are found in each student's grade level Google Classroom and are to be completed within specific courses throughout the year. For example, in learning period 1, all students in grades 8-12 are expected to complete the first of 3 ATL reflections and turn in to Google Classroom by **November 25, 2024**, in the following courses:

- Grade 8 Math 8 classes
- Grade 9 PHE 9 classes (Academy students to complete on their own)
- Grade 10 CLE 10 classes
- Grade 11 CLC 12 classes
- Grade 12 CLC 12 classes

Please note that a requirement of the **Rockridge Honour Roll is that all students complete all of the ATL reflections in order to remain eligible for Honour Roll Certificates. This is also outlined on our website under the Student tab - Honour Roll Here

Online Policies & Procedures Form 2024-2025 - Now at 81% of online consent forms completed!

This online verification and consent form requires a parent login and must be submitted for each student at the start of each school year. We ask that it is submitted ONLY ONCE PER STUDENT in September, as the upload gets very onerous with multiple submissions. For later changes, please inform the office.

- If you previously created an account to complete the 22/23 form, the account is the same.
- If you have forgotten your password, you can follow the instructions to reset it.
- Once logged in, you will have the option to either update a P+P form created last year or start a
 new one
- Without a completed consent form, students will not be permitted to attend field trips, join school teams or have their photos included in the yearbook. Permissions expire on August 31 each year.

ATTENDANCE - Notifying the Office and Extended Absences

School Drop Off/Pick Up Safety

As you are probably aware, there can be heavy traffic around our school site at opening and dismissal times. It is difficult for vehicles to enter and exit our school parking areas as well as the Caulfeild Mall. The passage of emergency vehicles would be impeded which is of considerable concern. Please consider carpooling, dropping off and picking up your children at a predetermined location away from the school property, and encouraging active transportation (biking, walking). Another helpful action, if possible, for those that have to drive is dropping off your child early. An 8:00 AM arrival is always a great plan and chance to hang in the cafeteria, get some work done at a hallway workstation, or connect with a teacher.

Please note that designated visitor parking spaces at the front of the school are a 'no parking' zone in the morning and after school. The driveway in front of the school entrance is a NO STOPPING zone. All numbered parking spaces are designated for individual staff members. Please do not park in these spaces at any time during school hours.

ATTENTION DOG WALKERS

The Rockridge sports field is a Classroom space, used by classes and teams, many of which have begun regular practices and games this fall. There has been a large amount of Dog Poop that is not only a distraction and slipping hazard, but also a health issue. We remind our community members that West Vancouver Bylaw prohibits dogs on the field and thank you for your cooperation in respecting this outdoor classroom space. *We would appreciate it if you would pass this on to other community members who should have this information.
