A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

FERRY SCHEDULE CHANGE - EFFECTIVE TODAY

As I shared previously, we have been notified that afternoon ferry departure will shift – from 3:30 to 3:55 pm starting today, May 15th. This was quite unexpected and something that BC Ferries communicated to our transportation department without consultation. As a result of this departure time change, Rockridge has adjusted the school bus departure from Rockridge to 3:07 pm. This will give students more time to get to the bus after they are dismissed from classes. It will also help reduce the wait time students will have after arriving in Horseshoe Bay. Buses on Bowen will be adjusted as well to coordinate with the new arrival time of the ferry.

FROM YOUR MYP COORDINATORS:

Last week, we began to look at the initial stage of Service Learning called 'Investigation'. As a recall, the first steps involved examining and reflecting on the skills and interests you already have and acknowledging the areas you think you could use some growth.

Did you do that folks?! :)

The next phase involves identifying an area in the community where you could help or assist in some way. And there are many different ways you could choose to engage! The ACTION you take on could look like:

- **Direct Service**
= You interact with the people, animals or the environment you're taking action to help!
- **Indirect Service**
= You do not interact directly with the recipients of your action which benefit the community. (Eg. You write a book! You raise money! You knit hats for those in need!)
- **Advocacy**
= You speak, write or perform on behalf of a cause or issue of community concern.
- **Research**
= You take on the process of research and data collection/analysis to influence or change a current policy or practice.

Seeing the categories above, *is there anything that comes to mind for you?*

Where could you contribute as individuals? What about as a family unit?

The other way you could approach identifying where you could take action is considering the spaces where:

- There is NEED in the community. You could take steps to start something new!
- There are GOOD programs/organizations already helping in the community. You could continue building on the good work already being done!

What comes to mind now?

Something in your neighbourhood? Our school community? Our city?

Still stuck? Consider having a look at the [United Nations 17 Sustainable Development Goals](#) for inspiration. These are goals aimed at making the world a good place for all people and species to live.

How could you engage?

Deciding where to take action might seem overwhelming because there's so much to DO, but helping in the bigger picture starts with taking action and contributing in your local community. Small changes CAN make a big difference!

Conduct research: Generate questions about the issue, problem, community and determine which of the below research methods would be best to provide answers to those questions.

- Media - Online (websites, blogs, videos, films), magazines, maps, photographs, etc.
- Interviews - Interviewing experts
- Surveys - Collecting information online, in-person
- Observations (and experience) - Authentic observation of the issue, problem and/or community

ACTION ITEMS FOR ROCKRIDGE PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Online Policies & Procedures Form 2024-2025 - NOW 96% of online consent forms completed!

This online verification and consent form requires a parent login and must be submitted for each student at the start of each school year. We ask that it is submitted ONLY ONCE PER STUDENT in September, as the upload gets very onerous with multiple submissions. For later changes, please inform the office.

- If you previously created an account to complete the 22/23 form, the account is the same.
- If you have forgotten your password, you can follow the instructions to reset it.
- Once logged in, you will have the option to either update a P+P form created last year or start a new one.

- Without a completed consent form, students will not be permitted to attend field trips, join school teams or have their photos included in the yearbook. Permissions expire on August 31 each year.

STUDENT PARKING AT ROCKRIDGE

Parking is available for Senior Students in the Upper Lot east of the Gym. Students must complete a parking [Registration form](#), noting vehicle details, insurance expiry, obtain parent signature and submit to the office. The \$25 decal fee must be paid through [School Cash Online](#). Once the form is returned and payment completed, we can issue a decal.

The designated parking spaces in the student lot are nearing capacity, and notices will be issued to those vehicles without a valid decal displayed.

Note: At no time are students permitted to park in Visitor or Staff designated spots

ATTENDANCE - Notifying the Office and Extended Absences

If you know your student will not be in attendance for all, or part of a school day, we ask that you please let our office know in advance - rockridge@wvschools.ca. Please include your child's first and last name and reason for absence in your email.

Daily attendance is critical to ensure student success here at Rockridge. **We do not recommend** absences during the school term but realize they may be unavoidable. Please keep in mind that certain classroom activities and assessments may not be able to be made up if missed. Please notify the school a minimum of one week in advance using this [form](#) for an extended absence. Teachers are not required to provide extra classes, make-up tests or specific work to be completed.

School Drop Off/Pick Up Safety

As you are probably aware, there can be heavy traffic around our school site at opening and dismissal times. It is difficult for vehicles to enter and exit our school parking areas as well as the Caulfeild Mall. The passage of emergency vehicles would be impeded which is of considerable concern. Please consider carpooling, dropping off and picking up your children at a predetermined location away from the school property, and encouraging active transportation (biking, walking). Another helpful action, if possible, for those that must drive is dropping off your child early. An 8:00 AM arrival is always a great plan and chance to hang in the cafeteria, get some work done at a hallway workstation, or connect with a teacher.

Please note that designated visitor parking spaces at the front of the school are a 'no parking' zone in the morning and after school. The driveway in front of the school entrance is a NO STOPPING zone. All numbered parking spaces are designated for individual staff members. Please do not park in these spaces at any time during school hours.

ATTENTION DOG WALKERS

The Rockridge sports field is a classroom space, used by classes and teams, especially now that spring has arrived. There has been a large amount of Dog Poop that is not only a distraction and slipping hazard, but also a health issue. We remind our community members that West Vancouver Bylaw prohibits dogs on the field and thank you for your cooperation in respecting this outdoor classroom space. *We would appreciate it if you would pass this on to other community members who should have this information.
