FROM YOUR MYP COORDINATORS:

Learning about Service Learning has taken us through **Stage 1 - Investigation** and **Stage 2 - Preparation**. This week, we move onto the stage everyone gets excited about: **Stage 3 - Action!** DOING something that works toward the common good reminds us of our humanity and the importance of working together in our communities.

When you take action to meet a community need, consider what kind of action is best. There are multiple ways to do this! Sometimes, one type of action is best, but other times, multiple types of action are more effective in making a meaningful impact.

The four main types of action are:

- 1) Direct Action You actively engage with people, animals or the environment to carry out thoughtfully planned initiatives.
 - Eg. helping tutor children who are language learners in the community, clean up garbage at a nearby beach, walking dogs for an animal shelter
- 2) Indirect Action You provide worthwhile contributions without seeing the recipients of this service.
 - Eg. stocking a local food pantry, donating children's books to a women's shelter, creating an online community newsletter for seniors, helping local non-profit organizations improve their online presence
- **3)** Advocacy You create awareness or promote action on an issue of public interest. Eg. writing letters to MPs, public speaking, using digital storytelling through social media to inform and persuade
- **4)** Research You find, gather and report on information that others can use to further a cause. Eg. help gather water testing information for local salmon runs, interview grade 8 students to see if they're feeling supported in their transitions to high school

Take a moment.

Consider the Rockridge learners in your household. Consider your family unit.

What are ways that you are already taking Action in your community?

What are other ways you might be able to grow in Action for the short-term? Over the long-term? This is not an effort to make you feel guilty. It's an encouragement to consider HOW you are (or could be!) supporting the communities around you. We are humans, there are times in our lives when we take from our communities, but we should aim to give back in some capacity as well so that we are maintaining them for the future.

Let's all do our part - take Action!

Parking is available for Senior Students in the Upper Lot east of the Gym. Students must complete a parking Registration form, noting vehicle details, insurance expiry, obtain parent signature and submit to the office. The \$25 decal fee must be paid through School Cash Online. Once the form is returned and payment completed, we can issue a decal.

The designated parking spaces in the student lot are nearing capacity, and notices will be issued to those vehicles without a valid decal displayed.

Note: At no time are students permitted to park in Visitor or Staff designated spots

ATTENDANCE - Notifying the Office and Extended Absences

If you know your student will not be in attendance for all, or part of a school day, we ask that you please let our office know in advance - rockridge@wvschools.ca Please include your child's first and last name and reason for absence in your email.

Daily attendance is critical to ensure student success here at Rockridge. **We do not recommend** absences during the school term but realize they may be unavoidable. Please keep in mind that certain classroom activities and assessments may not be able to be made up if missed.

Please notify the school a minimum of one week in advance using this **form** for an extended absence. Teachers are not required to provide extra classes, make-up tests or specific work to be completed.

School Drop Off/Pick Up Safety

As you are probably aware, there can be heavy traffic around our school site at opening and dismissal times. It is difficult for vehicles to enter and exit our school parking areas as well as the Caulfeild Mall. The passage of emergency vehicles would be impeded which is of considerable concern. Please consider carpooling, dropping off and picking up your children at a predetermined location away from the school property, and encouraging active transportation (biking, walking). Another helpful action, if possible, for those that have to drive is dropping off your child early. An 8:00 AM arrival is always a great plan and chance to hang in the cafeteria, get some work done at a hallway workstation, or connect with a teacher.

Please note that designated visitor parking spaces at the front of the school are a 'no parking' zone in the morning and after school. The driveway in front of the school entrance is a NO STOPPING zone. All numbered parking spaces are designated for individual staff members. Please do not park in these spaces at any time during school hours.

ATTENTION DOG WALKERS

The Rockridge sports field is a Classroom space, used by classes and teams, especially now that spring has arrived. There has been a large amount of Dog Poop that is not only a distraction and slipping hazard, but also a health issue. We remind our community members that West Vancouver Bylaw prohibits dogs on the field and thank you for your cooperation in respecting this outdoor classroom space. *We would appreciate it if you would pass this on to other community members who should have this information.
