## Staffing Update

Treasurer's Report - Christina Argyros
Bank Balances as of October $7^{\text {th }}, 2016$
RBC General Account $\$ 192,604.67$ which includes the income generated from Hot Lunch of $\$ 63,785.86$. This is half way through our projected income for the year.

RBC Gaming Account $\$ 7,985.59$ which includes the grant money of $\$ 7,980.00$. This grant is used for FUN field trips.

District Trust Account Net balance of $\$ 63,879.11$
Payments for the document cameras and conference tables (gala wish list items) are coming through now. We are still expecting payments for the projector and table tennis tables to be processed.

## DPAC Update - Helen Pankratz

Chris Kennedy, Superintendant, reported:

- Enrolment in the District is up; International student enrolment is down slightly (by design) from 600 to 576 students. Homestays are needed for International students
- French Immersion enrolment is also up.
- ELL is up slightly in elementary schools
-Reporting and Exams are the hot topics this year:
-what kind of feedback do parents want?
-there will be a district wide event on the topic of reporting sometime around January, similar to the one on the curriculum held last year -report cards for 4-7s will be like last year's piloted gr 4 report card -no changes yet to grade 8-12 report cards
-There will be an parent ed event with Police and Medical representation regarding the dangers on Fentanyl (However, fentanyl is not a big issue so far in West Van; Alcohol is a bigger problem.)


## Committee Updates:

Halloween Committee - Cora MacDonald
Kick off meeting was held last month, with a great turn out from volunteers. Plans are to have the Halloween party for the K-3's on Monday, October $31^{\text {st }}$, under the covered area next to the preschool from 1:10 until 3:50. A sign up genius will come out shortly for volunteer sign ups.

Kitchen Committee - Danielle Katerberg
