- School Goal: Where to next?
 - A. Based on teachers 'scanning' of our learners, strengths at many grades included creative thinking and communication. Challenges include critical thinking, critical listening, problem-solving, independent thinking (making decisions)
 - B. We want to move into the area of critical thinking. This is one of the Ministry Competencies identified as key in students' development.
 - Already worked on 'Communication competency' for 3 years
 - Moving into Critical Thinking
 - · Analyze and critique
 - Analyze and make judgements about a work, a position, a process, a performance or another product
 - Consider purpose, focus on evidence and use criteria to draw conclusions and make judgments; consider a variety of perspectives
 - Reflect and evaluate their thinking
 - · Question and investigate
 - Engage in an inquiry where they identify and explore questions or challenges related to key issues; develop and refine questions, evaluate the credibility of sources of information
 - Develop and design
 - Apply critical thinking to create or transform products, methods, performances, and representations in response to problems, events, issues and needs (develop and refine plans)

Ties in with executive function (cognitive domain)

Executive functioning is a term used to describe the many tasks our brains perform that are necessary to think, act, and solve problems.

- Executive Skills
 - Metacognition
 - · Specify what is to be evaluated and how
 - Evaluate performance for the student

- Provide sample to match or error-monitoring checklist
- Embed metacognitive questions into instruction (teach students to ask questions)

New Business

Proposed Bylaw Amendment:

The proposed addition to sections **X- EXECUTIVE**, and **XI - DUTIES OF OFFICERS** will add the position of "Member(s) at Large". A Member-at-Large would help us have more broad representation on the executive committee, and can help with PAC business: ex. could assist with communications (e-mail newsletters, website updates), help coordinate volunteers, fundraisers, etc.

Proposed wording:

Member(s)-at-Large shall:

1. Be members who have an interest in the school-wide nature of the business of the PAC;

- 2. Expect to be involved in one or more committees as a member or chairperson;
- 3. Be prepared to fulfill other special functions as necessary

The following corrections will also be made:

- under section XIV FINANCES, sub-section 5:
 - "...at least thirty fifteen (15) days prior..."
- under section IX TERM OF OFFICE, sub-section 4:

"No person may hold more than one elected executive position at any one time, with the exception of positions the DPAC representative, where these this positions may be held concurrently with a position of WBPAC executive officer."

A vote will be held at the May meeting to adopt the changes.

Proposed By-law amendments

page 6:

4. No person may hold more than one elected executive position at any one time, with the exception of positions the DPAC representative, where these this positions may be held concurrently with a position of WBPAC executive officer.

SECTION X - EXECUTIVE

- 1. The affairs of the WBPAC shall be managed by the elected Executive Officers.
- 2. The Executive Officers will be as follows:
 - A. Chairperson or Co-Chairpersons
 - B. Vice-Chairperson(s) optional if two Co-Chairpersons
 - C. Secretary or Co-secretaries
 - D. Treasurer or Co-treasurers
 - E. DPAC representative(s)
 - F. Member(s)-at-Large
 - G. Past Chairperson (not elected)

page 9:

F. Members-at-Large shall:

- 1. Be members who have an interest in the school-wide nature of the business of the PAC;
- 2. Expect to be involved in one or more committees as a member or chairperson;
- 3. Be prepared to fulfill other special functions as necessary

page 10:

Annual budget

5. The Executive Committee will prepare a budget and provide it to the membership for approval annually by way of a Material Vote as defined in Section VII in Quorum. The budget must be provided in written form to the members at least thirty fifteen (15) days prior to the general meeting date on which the budget is scheduled for approval by the WBPAC members.
