 - **ii.** Prioritizing school exposure notifications to ensure the potential of transmission source settings is minimized. We ask the notifications for potential school exposures to be prioritized be extended to include anyone who attends or works at the school with the COVID-19 positive individual. Details of classes affected should be made available. 24 in favor, one against.
 - **iii.** Barrier free, timely and convenient access to testing and PCR testing for both symptomatic and presymptomatic face interact students. 22 in favor, one against
