Students channeled their creativity to welcome people displaced by war and other crises by creating postcards that will be sent to young refugees around the world. The Bezos Family Foundation is donating \$10 for every postcard created.

STAVE FALLS - MISSION

For their Sharing The Planet unit of inquiry, the Grade 6 students attended an interactive field trip at the historic Powerhouse at Stave Falls dam in Mission, BC.

Students explored the creation of the power plant as well as how hydroelectricity is produced and transmitted to our homes and business.



GRADE 2 - DIVISION 11

Students enjoyed a sunny day at the Seymour River Hatchery in North Vancouver.

We had fun learning about the hatchery process itself (harvesting eggs from female salmon, storing them in refrigerated trays, removing dead ones each day to prevent disease, then releasing them to troughs for alevin and fry stages, and finally put outside in the covered pond for the smolt stage where we got to feed them by throwing food through the mesh and watching thousands of them jump at once.

We learned about the different kinds of salmon that spawn there – Coho, Chum, Chinook, Pink, Steelhead, Cutthroat etc.



Students took turns putting on hip waders to go into the river to collect insects to look at under microscopes and also do to measuring activities – temperature, width and depth of the river.

Another station was to conduct a stream survey to determine if this was a healthy environment for salmon.





QUEEN BEE WATCH

Students have been busy observing the hive, looking for the Queen Bee.

You can see her entourage around her as she lays eggs. She has a distinctive black spot on her back and a long black body. In the photo she is located between the top two white lines.

The Bee Flower garden that students planted recently includes hollyhocks, sunflowers, cosmos, sweet peas and a specific blend of wildflowers designed to attract and feed pollinators.






