WEST VANCOUVER SCHOOLS SUMMER LEARNING IN PERSON REGISTRATION FOR SECONDARY COURSES

West Vancouver Schools Summer Learning will be holding an in-person late registration session for all secondary courses with available space on Friday, June 30 from 10:00 – 11:00 am at the Inglewood Learning Center meeting room, which is located at 1735 Inglewood Avenue (the eastern portable at the bottom of the West Vancouver Secondary School campus).

Registration will be available for **students currently registered in a West Vancouver School** and will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. The placement priority order which was in place during online registration does not apply to in-person registration. A list of available courses is indicated below but availability of courses cannot be guaranteed on the day. Please also note that registration for secondary full-credit courses will only be available to students who have just completed Grades 9-11.

2023-24 ELEMENTARY BAND FOR GRADE 6 AND 7 STUDENTS

Registration for our band program is now open.

Students are offered a choice of woodwind, brass or percussion instruments to learn and play in our concert band. Students receive two lessons a week.

The Band Program provides school-based instrumental instruction and is funded by supplemental fees.

Registration placed between March 1 – June 1 are \$390 and after June 1 will be \$425. No experience is necessary for students to join the program.

VOLUNTARY ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL

SUMMER CAMP INCLUSION PROGRAM



Did you know? Our **Access Services** team is available to provide support for children who may need assistance during summer camps.

If your family is not providing your own support person, our **Summer Camps Inclusion Program** offers support to children aged 5 – 15 (subject to availability and funding). Your child must be able to use the washroom as well as change and transfer independently. Your child's safety, the safety of other participants, and the safety of District of West Vancouver staff are our primary considerations.

If your child receives full or part-time support of an Education Assistant (EA) during the school year or if your child requires support to participate in recreation, please fill out a Summer Camp Recreation Inclusion (SCRI) application and let us know when you have registered or are waitlisted by calling 604-925-7279. The SCRI application is also available at any recreation facility front desk.

Children may receive a maximum of 1 – 2 weeks of support during the summer. Applications are processed on a first-come basis.

SUMMER DAY CAMPS

Fun for everyone!

Access Services Department of the District of West Vancouver is committed to making summer camps accessible and supportive to children of all abilities. Please complete a 2023 Recreation Inclusion Application Form online or in person at the West Vancouver Community Centre.

One-to-one inclusion support

If your child requires one-to-one support at camp, arrangements can be made to provide an Inclusion Support Worker for two weeks of summer camp. Inclusion Support Workers are certified:

- Standard First Aid and CPR-C
- Successful Criminal Record vulnerable sector checks
- Receive on the job training for non-violent crisis intervention and specialized training to equip them to work with your child.

Note: it is the responsibility of the parent or organization to cover the costs of the camp; the Inclusion Support Worker is free to you (pending grant approvals from Canada Summer Jobs).

We are unable to provide support for campers who require transfers, toileting, changing, or are unable to administer their own medications (except for Epi Pens).

Does your child require additional support at camp?

Participants generally require one-to-one support if:

- Extra support is required at school
- Your child is diagnosed with a disability that affects mobility, communication, comprehension, social interaction, and/or behaviour.
- Your child has difficulty participating independently in a group setting.
