Students visited Lynn Canyon this week to participate in a hands-on outdoor field study, exploring microhabitats in the park in order to better understand biodiversity of the rainforest.










GRADE 5s - HOW THE WORLD WORKS "Machines and How They Function"

DEBATE CLUB UPDATE

The Debate Club has been a great success with lots of laughs and topics learned. Just in the span of 5 weeks, the club has discussed what debate is, how to write an effective hook, generate arguments, and lastly how to write a full argument. Furthermore, topics discussed revolved around real world issues challenging students to think, research, and collaborate with others.

Some topics include:

- Whether or not to ban smoking
- If homeschooling is preferred over traditional schooling
- Should social media be banned or not
- Whether the education traits of zoos outweigh the harms to animals
- If we should ban video games (sorry parents, the answer was a definitive no)

All of these topics were explored through hands-on activities. For example activities such as in class competition between which side could generate more arguments or through a hot balloon activity. In this simulation, the world is ending, and the only means of survival was to remain aboard a hot air balloon. To make it even more challenging, students were assigned random objects daily, ranging from pens to headphones, and were required to employ their persuasion skills to secure a spot on the balloon - Jason and Jerry S

WHEN SHOULD I KEEP MY SICK CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL?

Things to consider if your child feels unwell:

- 1. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be at risk for other illnesses.
- 2. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.
- 3. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.
- 4. The protection of other children

Please keep your child home if they:

- Have a fever
- Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities
- Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox or measles)
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea. It is recommended that students be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to school.

GRADE 7 FAMILIES - HIGH SCHOOL

Families do not need to register for Rockridge. If you are applying for another district high school, and reside out of catchment for that school, you cannot register ONLINE before 15 January 2024.




