

BUILDING STRONG FOUNDATIONS

SHARING THE PLANET UNIT OF INQUIRY Observing and documenting the environment

Students in Grade 1 began this exploration by first finding something in the natural environment around West Bay that they didn't pay much attention to in the past. After collecting a small sample, the students decided together that they'd like to make nature cards. They sketched and labeled important parts on one side and on the other side they presented their information.



WHERE WE ARE IN PLACE AND TIME

Throughout times, humans have sought to understand the universe My class and I went to Vancouver's Macmillan Space Centre. We arrived at the museum and we went to the Sky theatre. In the theatre, we learned about different planets and we got a close-up look at them. The sky theatre has a 360 degree screen that can spin or zoom out to give the audience a really realistic view of space. My favourite part of this station was when the screen zoomed into Saturn's ring. We then explored the space gallery. As I walked around, I saw some astronauts suits, and some air dried food that is eaten in space. However, my favourite part of the gallery was when there was a little piece of rock that was brought back from the moon by an astronaut. It was on display and you were given the chance to touch the moon! After we ate lunch, we went to another theatre but this time, we learned how to spot planets using the gas spectrum. We can spot planets by using data that is collected by robots in space and whenever the sun gets covered by a planet, we receive information that something has fully orbited around the sun causing it to be blocked in front of the robot. I learned a lot at the space centre and hope to go back soon! - Jack G, Division 4 Student





WHEN SHOULD I KEEP MY SICK CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL?

Things to consider if your child feels unwell :

- 1. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be at risk for other illnesses.
- 2. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.
- 3. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.
- 4. The protection of other children

Please keep your child home if they :

- Have a fever
- Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities
- Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox or measles)
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea.

It is recommended that students be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to school.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

We will have two drills this term that parents/guardians should know about.

The first is a Lockdown Drill on Tuesday, January 23. A lockdown is where students and staff lock themselves in a classroom or other space. Lockdowns are used if there is a danger in the building such as an unsafe person. If you would like to learn more about the drill, please click <u>here</u> for more information.

The second drill is a Student Release Drill on Thursday, February 15th, from 1:30-3:00 PM. The Student Release Drill is an opportunity to practise releasing students to parents/authorized guardians in a safe and efficient manner in the event of a serious emergency such as after an earthquake or lockdown. Further details will be shared with families in late January but for now, it is important that parents/guardians know that they will need to pick their child up, or arrange to have their child picked up by someone authorized to do so, sometime between 1:30-3:00 PM on Thursday, February 15th.
