



### GRADE 2 (DIV 11) STUDENT, EVA M EXPLAINS HER MATH STRATEGIES



The first one is called Open Number Line. I put the biggest number first then I jumped ten three times to make thirty and 52+10=62+10=72+10=82 and do three bunny hops and the answer is 85!

The second one is Break apart so you do 52+33 first we start with the tens you put a line underneath the tens then you add up and draw a line down and right down the answer for the tens. Then do the same thing for the ones add them all up and the answer is 85

The third one is called Drawing add up so you draw a drawing five tens which are sticks then draw two ones which is dots and then a plus+ then draw 33 count them all up and the answer is 85!

### WHEN SHOULD I KEEP MY SICK CHILD HOME FROM SCHOOL?

### Things to consider if your child feels unwell:

- 1. Without proper rest, a child may have a hard time fighting an illness or be at risk for other illnesses.
- 2. The ability of your child to actively take part and learn at school.
- 3. The school staff cannot care for a sick child and give them the support that they may need.
- 4. The protection of other children

### Please keep your child home if they:

- Have a fever
- Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities
- Have a suspected or known communicable disease (i.e. strep throat, chicken pox or measles)
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea.

It is recommended that students be symptom free for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
