HIVE UPDATE - Magali at BEEWATCH

Spring has finally arrived! The hive is teeming with life. The worker bees are beginning to raise new bees for the warmer season. The gueen is the only bee that lays eggs in the hive, so she is the mother of all the bees you can see in the hive! Each egg is laid at the bottom of a hexagonal cell. When the eggs hatch, the workers take care of feeding the young larvae with pollen and nectar. These larvae will spend 10 days eating voraciously. After that, the workers will seal the cells and wait for the larva to metamorphose into an adult bee. When this happens, the young bee tears open the little cap covering its cell and ventures out to discover its colony! During these early spring months, it's still too cold for the bees to fly. They eat the nectar we provide them and eagerly await the arrival of sunny days! Then they can venture out to gather nectar and pollen from nearby flowers and bring these valuable resources back to the hive to raise even more young bees. The queen can lay up to 1500 eggs per day, so you'll see the colony grow rapidly!

FUN FACT - Bees see their food through an ultraviolet spectrum




