

Access to Resources Shape How People Live Div 11 students, Gr 2 were asked, How might you use what you see to live in these different environments - tropical jungle, temperate forest, desert, and farm (prairie)? These are called resources and people use what is available in their community. We watched a video on a desert community and also read a book about Homes Around the World



HOW WE EXPRESS OURSELVES BUILDING SKILLS AS ARTISTS

Gr 2 students watched a demo of paintbrush techniques and how to apply a sequence of coloured stripes starting with dark blue and getting lighter for the sky. Students used 3 different brushes and blended acrylic paint, then added 3 tones of green and blue for mountains in the foreground along with an ocean using blues with tints of white for a realistic effect.



KINDERGARTEN INQUIRY INTO WHAT A STORY IS

From Cave Drawings to the Printing Press and Beyond This week we started learning about stories. Some questions we are asking are: What is a story? Do stories only exist in books? Can stories be shared in other ways? Our class will be exploring all of these questions in the next few weeks with Ms. Olljum and the students will be creating their own stories using different materials in the classroom.


