SUMMARY OF LEARNING CLICK <u>HERE</u> TO ACCESS

On Thursday, June 27th, families will receive a Summary of Learning document, similar to a report card. Unlike the Learning Updates of Terms One and Two, this report is a summary of the progress your child has made this school year and the performance descriptors (Emerging, Developing, Proficient, or Extending) indicate your child's ability after the school year. Because the summary captures the entire school year, it is focused on the skills, competencies, and Approaches to learning that students developed throughout the year rather than the knowledge and understandings that are typically developed in the Themes of Inquiry each term. BC's Curriculum has a "Know, Understand, Do" model, and the focus of the Summary of Learning is therefore on the "Do": what can your child do, and how independently can they do it.

You can get a sense of what students know and understand from Term Three through their online portfolio and work they have brought home.

You will receive an email on June 27th with a link to the MyEd. Family Portal. This is how you have accessed previous reports.

GR 3 FIELD TRIP TO BIGHOUSE IN SQUAMISH

Grade Three students went to the Paradise Valley Cheakamus Centre on Tuesday of this week and had an amazing day! The children cooked soup using hot rocks, baked Bannock bread on sticks over coals in the fire pit and tried several skills that Indigenous people used to survive, such as weaving with wool or softened cedar bark. In the gratitude circle at the end of the day, students spoke of being so grateful for the weather that allowed them to go that day (after our winter date was rained out), the beautiful, natural setting and for the teachings of the Elders.

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PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES

On January 26th, 2024, the Province announced three significant actions to enhance the safety and well-being of students in relation to digital technology, including the introduction of restrictions on the use of personal digital devices in schools (this would apply to cell phones, laptops, tablets, smartwatches, etc.). These updated policies will be in place for the 24-25 school year.

Most West Vancouver Schools already have technology guidelines in place. We recognize that the unregulated use of personal devices can be a significant distraction from learning. These devices can interrupt class time, interfere with student focus and disrupt the educational environment. However, we also understand that when used thoughtfully and with supervision, digital technology can offer valuable opportunities for our students. These tools can enhance the learning by enabling students to create content, communicate, collaborate and share.

Starting in September we will be refocusing our approach with personal digital device use in both elementary and secondary schools. In compliance with our technology guidelines, personal digital devices will only be used with the direct permission of the teacher and/or administrator, who will provide clear guidelines to ensure their use is intentional and purposeful in supporting student learning. Additionally, considerations will be made to accommodate students' medical and health needs, accessibility, and accommodation requirements.

Applicable times:

Secondary Schools: Personal digital device expectations will be in effect during instructional time.

Elementary Schools: Personal digital device expectations will be in effect throughout the full school day, including before school, after school, and during break times.

More detailed information about these new expectations will be shared at the start of the 2024-25 school year. In September, we will ask parents and guardians to support these guidelines by minimizing calls and texts to their children during school hours. It is important for students to remain focused and engaged in their learning without the expectation of responding immediately to messages. We also encourage families to start thinking about how they can support these new expectations to ensure a smooth transition for everyone.

Thank you for your attention and cooperation as we work together to create a safe and productive learning environment for our students.






West Vancouver Basketball Club Summer Camps
