HOW THE WORLD WORKS IN GRADE 3

Natural Forces Create Change

Students have been investigating landforms and developing their scientific observation skills. Their curiosity has sparked deeper inquiry into different types of rocks and the processes that shape them. This week, our young "rock scientists" have been busy collecting specimens, making detailed observations, and forming hypotheses about rock formation. Keep up the great exploration, Grade 3s!







HOW WE EXPRESS OURSELVES IN GRADE 2

Grade 2 Students designed their animal stuffy with indigenous shapes - crescents, ovoids, U shapes, trigons etc. They used an up and down stitch to attach details and then a blanket stitch around the edge to hold the stuffing in. Students are writing legend stories to go with their animals for their unit of of inquiry How We Express Ourselves.



INTERNATIONAL LEGO DAY! SO MUCH FUN


Drop everything and Lego! ...and this is just what we did on

HOW WE EXPRESS OURSELVES IN GRADE 7

Grade 7s have been exploring religious expression through architecture and art. Grade 7s chose a place of worship and piece of religious art, researched the building and art piece and explored how it conveys meaning. They will continue with their inquiry with upcoming visits to a Synagogue and Mosque and conversation with an Indigenous Leader about spirituality.





VOLUNTARY ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL

Please understand that if you are choosing to take extended holidays when classes are in session, teachers cannot replicate the learning that happens within the classroom and are not able to provide online learning opportunities.

Once your bag is labeled, use your phone to **TEXT our code "SGTS"** to the number listed on the kiosk. You will be texted back with a PIN to type into the keypad next to the door.
