


A unique angle on the ever-popular children's fact book.

#### **VOLUNTARY ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL**

Families may email their child's teacher(s) to see if there is other work their child can do, however, our teachers' energy and focus continues to be on the learning of students within the classroom.

#### **Grade 7 Bottle Return! Fundraiser**

#### **Instructions:**

Put in our user phone number 604-839-8114 to PRINT sticker LABELS for your bag(s) from the kiosk. (This label will ensure that West Bay gets money from the bottles.) Once your bag is labeled, use your phone to TEXT our code "SGTS" to the number listed on the kiosk. You will be texted back with a PIN to type into the keypad next to the door. Place the bag inside, no sorting needed.

#### **DISTRICT/ COMMUNITY EVENTS**

#### **OPEN PARACHUTE**

Open Parachute is a school program being used in West Vancouver classrooms in grades 6-9. It is one tool we are using to support social emotional learning.

This resource is also available to all parents and it is fantastic. Parents are strongly encouraged (no matter the age of your child) to sign up and create an account.

You will have access to short video clips and lessons to help equip parents to handle those emotional ups and downs that are inevitable. To sign up for an account use this <u>link</u>.

#### Substance Use Prevention, Part 2:

#### **Mental Health & Decision-Making Information Sessions**

In partnership with adolescent clinical psychologist Dr. Hayley Watson from Open Parachute, the ministry will host three, <u>free virtual sessions</u> for parents, guardians and caregivers that will focus on practical skills you can teach your child and youth (ages 0-19) to prevent substance use and mental health challenges. These sessions will build on a <u>previous presentation</u>, which focused on practical conversation tools for speaking about substance use prevention with your children/youth. The previous session is not a prerequisite for this one.
