2025-26 IB FEES

IB Fees will increase to \$550 for the 2025-2026 school year, pending approval from the Board of Education. The increase is due to salary increases from the 2022-2025 Collective Agreement with teachers. At West Bay, we have an IB Coordinator as well as other teachers who release our classroom and other teachers to meet with our IB Coordinator to discuss planning and assessment. Our built-in weekly professional development for teachers accounts for almost all of our revenue from school fees. We will offer payment options as soon as the school fee is approved by the Board.







OPEN PARACHUTE


