Dear Parents/Guardians,

Over the coming months, West Bay teachers will configure students into classes for the 2025-2026 school year. You may complete <u>this form</u> to share information you feel should be considered when placing your child for the next school year. This form is optional.

The class placement process is very complex as teachers consider the individual needs of students as well as group dynamics. When placing students, school personnel consider teachers' observations of individual needs and social dynamics, input from support staff, class size and composition (learning and behavior needs, gender), and learning styles. **Parent feedback is valued and will be considered, but it is important for families to know that there are many other factors that affect the placement**

of students and teachers' observations drive placement decisions. If you hope that your child is placed with close peers, please note that we aim to place children with peers who they learn well with (feel connected to; support each other's learning; don't distract each other; and make good decisions together).

If you have input, please ensure it is shared before this form closes on Friday, May 16, so that it can be taken into consideration.

POVERTY AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT PYP EXHIBITION GROUP

The group visited **Shelter to Home** this week and took action connected with their Exhibition study of poverty. They helped out with a Saturday Lunch program that runs each week. Volunteers from Highlands United Church and the community prepare bagged meals for unhoused people and people of limited incomes. Those meals are distributed at the North Shore Neighbourhood House in Lower Lonsdale. The boys helped to make about 225 sandwiches each of the two weekends that their team helped, which were then packed with cookies, fruit and a drink box to be distributed. They also made cookies in the school kitchen which could be used by the feeding program.



HEALTHCARE AND ACCESSIBILITY PYP EXHIBITION GROUP The group visited the Centre based on the North Shore. The North Shore Women's Centre is dedicated to improving the social, economic, legal and political status of women, and encourages and supports self-empowerment by acting as a resource and a catalyst for change, from feminist perspectives. Students helped pack fresh produce packages for 75 clients.

Dear Student, Parents, Guardians and Staff

Re: Reminder to get your vaccinations updated. Measles is on the rise globally and pertussis (whooping cough) is making a comeback locally.

We would like to remind you to check your family's vaccination records and update your vaccinations as needed. Measles cases are being reported around the world. Please get your measles immunizations up to date, particularly if you are planning on travelling for Spring break. Two doses of measles containing vaccine are needed for everyone born 1970 or later. Children are usually offered these vaccines at 12 months of age and kindergarten entry. While most school age children are immunized, some may have missed their first or second dose during the pandemic. Infants travelling to high-risk areas can get a dose starting at 6 months. Those born before 1970 are considered protected but you may receive one dose if you do not recall a history of measles infection and are travelling to an area with active transmission.

Please also ensure that your family's pertussis immunizations are up to date. Pertussis is a bacterial infection of the lungs that is making a return. While people of any age can get ill, young children who have not been immunized get sicker than older children and adults. Children are offered pertussis-containing vaccines at 2, 4, 6, 18 months, 4-6 years, and in grade 9. Pertussis immunization is also recommended during pregnancy for the protection of newborns.

Adults can be immunized by their family doctor or pharmacist (<u>Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) Vaccines | BC</u> <u>Pharmacy Association</u>). If you are unsure if your child is fully protected against measles, pertussis or other vaccine preventable diseases, please visit <u>BC Health Gateway</u> or scan this QR code to book an appointment:
