### SHARING THE PLANET RESEARCHING LIKE SCIENTISTS


Gr 4 students explored how animals depend on coral reefs. Their central idea, humans contribute to environmental complexity, helped guide their thinking as we learned about interdependence, behaviour, and survival in this vibrant ecosystem. Students practised being scientists and are developing research skills such as questioning, analyzing information, and communicating their findings. Students created connection maps to investigate the form and function of coral reef systems and explore how living things are interdependent within an ecosystem.





A GIANT THANKS to our Outreach Team, who have been busy at work packaging up the winter clothing, buying toys & gifts, purchasing bulk grocery gift cards & wrapping each present with holiday paper, bows & festive tags.

Our PAC proudly supports **Edmonds Community School,** a lifeline for many newcomer families living at or below the poverty line. This year, we were able to expand our support dramatically — from 16 families to over 60 students and their families. The school also keeps grocery cards for families in need year-round.

- Family 3: A family of four two teens and a 7-year-old with special needs doing their best to make ends meet. Their mom works long hours at a butcher shop to provide for them.
- Family 4: A family with 2 sons moved here for a "better life" from Nigeria. The mom is trying to get training in the healthcare field, and the boys take the transit by themselves to school. They like to play soccer and Lego, and are very well behaved, respectful children.

We will be sharing final numbers next week once the donation link closes and we get the final gifts purchased for the additional families.


