Please help us make a difference in these families' lives and thank you for your support in continuing this West Bay tradition!


#### **SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR - THE EXCITEMENT!**



#### NUMERACY IN GRADE 1 - THE HUCKLEBERRY GAME

\*Counting on and counting back

\*Numbers to 10 can be arranged and recognized.

\*Comparing and ordering numbers to 20

Task: Playing the huckleberry game, students took turns picking up beads and counting them out onto a ten frame.

After each student had counting on the ten frame they counted on to find the total. These "berries" (beads) were then used to create personal bracelets!

**Home Extension Task:** 

I counted 24 beads, help my check my bracelet bead count at home. Did I get it right?






