



"Sharing the Planet" and "Who We Are"

Knowledge Keeper, Tsitsáyxemaat Rebecca Duncan and her daughter Nuuw! Chamiya from the Squamish Nation were our Indigenous Experts last week.

They visited our Gr 4 classes where students are learning about how seasonal changes (of the land, animals etc) influence the different activities of the Squamish people. Gr 1 students learned about the local names of indigenous plants and animals and our Gr 3 students learned about the importance and significance of potlatches in Squamish culture.

VANCOUVER AQUARIUM FIELD TRIP


Recently, Gr 3 classes visited the Vancouver Aquarium to wrap up our IB sharing the planet unit. Students explored marine habitats, observed animals up close, and made real-world connections to our learning about interdependence and adaptations. It was a fun, hands-on way to celebrate and deepen our understanding of ecosystems!











WOW! A huge congratulations everyone! What an incredible team effort. Together, we not only met our goal, we blew past it, raising \$6,425! And to make this even more amazing, Moms Against Poverty have joined us with a generous additional donation of \$100 per student for groceries, bringing our grand total to an outstanding \$\$12,200!

Each year, our PAC supports **Edmonds Community School** — a vital hub for newcomer families to Canada, many living at or below the poverty line. This year, we were fortunate enough to sponsor 57 students & their families.

- Family 1 Background: A family of four with a 6-year-old girl and a 3-month-old baby boy. The mom had to abandon her medical studies in Afghanistan after the Taliban threatened her life. They fled for safety and now live in a severely rodent-infested building, while the dad struggles to find work. They're rebuilding from nothing.
- Family 2 Background: A family from Uganda with two sons. The mom is a trained teacher, but her credentials aren't recognized here, so she must retrain to teach again in B.C. The boys' worn-through shoes are a small but clear sign of how much they're going without.

The school will also sets aside some grocery gift cards for families in need year-round, so additional donations this week will support that. The <u>link</u> will stay open until Nov 28.

Your generosity shows just how our community can come together to brighten the season for others. Thank you, truly. Through this initiative, we're sharing more than gifts – we're sharing compassion, inclusion, and the spirit of community that connects us all.





- If you absolutely have to get out of your car, please wait until you are in the furthest spot forward so you are not in the way.
 Please remind your child (we'll do the same) to be ready for you: they are looking

for your car and have their backpack ready.
