


HOW THE WORLD WORKS IN GRADE 3

Inquiry into how the earth's surface gets its shape

Students explored landforms from around the world - what did they discover?

HOW THE WORLD WORKS IN KINDERGARTEN

Students were invited to work together to design and create the best obstacle course they could. This provocation encouraged them to explore how things move, balance, and change while testing their ideas through play and experimentation. Throughout the activity, students used their thinking skills to plan, problem-solve, and make decisions about their obstacle course.



They also practiced important communication skills by sharing ideas, listening to others, and working collaboratively as a team. This experience helped students understand that scientists ask questions, try out ideas, work together, and learn from what happens. Parents, ask your budding scientist how they got their ball to move.


100 DAYS SMARTER

BLACK HISTORY MONTH


FAIRYTALE FAMOUS BLACK CANADIANS

VIOLA DESMOND was a Canadian businesswoman who bravely challenged segregation in 1946 by refusing to leave a movie theatre in Nova Scotia.






MICHAËLLE JEAN is a journalist, author & community leader who became Canada's Governor General & is known for her strong commitment to inclusion & youth.






ALL BECAUSE YOU MATTER is a poetic story of a mother affirming her son's worth and belonging, even when the world makes him feel unseen.


WISHLIST RESOURCES IPADS (\$560)





A PROBLEM WITH SOLUTIONS

It takes way too long for parents to pick up their children after school. Fortunately, this problem is solvable. The most helpful are:

1. Please pull up as far as you can to pick up your child so cars behind you can do the same.
2. If you absolutely have to get out of your car, please wait until you are in the furthest spot forward so you are not in the way.
3. Please remind your child (we'll do the same) to be ready for you: they are looking for your car and have their backpack ready.

VOLUNTARY ABSENCES FROM SCHOOL

Please understand that if you are choosing to take extended holidays when classes are in session, teachers cannot replicate the learning that happens within the classroom and are not able to provide online learning opportunities.

Our teachers do their very best to support students during required absences due to illness, however, when the absence is voluntary and a family's choice (such as extending a weekend, holiday, or vacation), it is a family's responsibility to maintain academic learning at home.

Please take time to read with your child, have them write in a "holiday" journal, do Math IXL online, participate in any assignments shared via Google Classroom (intermediate students), and take advantage of other emergent opportunities to practise foundational skills (e.g. following instructions and using math while cooking).

Families may email their child's teacher(s) to see if there is other work their child can do, however, our teachers' energy and focus continues to be on the learning of students within the classroom

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

Please ensure you pull as far forward as possible to avoid a backlog behind you. If you need to get out to look for your child, wait until you are in spots 1 or 2.
