Daily Health Check It is important that parents continue to do a thorough **DAILY HEALTH CHECK.** At school we have always followed the same procedures regarding student illnesses - when children are sick and not well enough to be at school and participate fully in all aspects of the day, for any reason, parents will be contacted and asked to pick up their child. The purpose of this has always been to ensure the child receives the care they need and that the illness is not spread at the school.

present. A Call Back program is in place to check on students who are absent if no contact with the school has been made. We will continue to carefully monitor all absences and ask that you use this central communication rather than or as well as emailing individual classroom teachers. 
Here are some tips to help you arrive at school punctually:


- Limit Morning Distractions: Avoid distractions like TV, video games, or social media in the morning. Focus on getting ready and having breakfast.

- **Check the School Schedule:** Be aware of any special events or early start times at the school. Make sure your child is informed and prepared for these exceptions.

Be a Role Model: Children often learn by example. Demonstrate punctuality and good time management yourself so that your child sees the importance of

their own, making their bed, or preparing a simple breakfast.



CHILD MATE Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day that honours the children who survived Indian Residential Schools and remembers those who did not. This day relates to the experience of Phyllis Webstad, a Northern Secwpemc (Shuswap) from the Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation, on her first day of school, where she arrived dressed in a new orange shirt, which was taken from her. It is now a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. Canadians are invited to wear an orange shirt to acknowledge the painful legacy of residential schools and the harm that Canada's residential school system continues to have on generations of




