on time is an important aspect of being a responsible and successful student. Westcot students in Kindergarten - Grade 4 begin the day at 8:40 am. Grade 5 - 7 students begin their day at 8:50 am. Here are some tips to help you arrive at school punctually: **Set a Routine:** Establish a daily routine that includes a set time for waking up, getting ready, and leaving for school. Stick to this routine consistently.

Arrive on Time It is imperative that students arrive at school on time. Arriving to school

- **Prepare the Night Before:** Before going to bed, ensure that backpack is packed with all the necessary snacks, lunch, water bottle, assignments, and supplies. Limit Morning
- **Distractions:** Avoid distractions like TV, video games, or social media in the morning. Focus on getting ready and having breakfast. **Account for Traffic:** Account for traffic conditions and plan to leave a few minutes earlier if necessary.

Promote Independence: Encourage your child to take on age-appropriate responsibilities in their morning routine. This can include getting dressed on their own,


- school. Make sure your child is informed and prepared for these exceptions. Be a Role Model: Children often learn by example. Demonstrate punctuality and good time management yourself so that your child sees the importance of arriving on time.
- Your support and guidance as a parent are essential in allowing the day in our classrooms to

begin on time, with no distractions to students ready to learn. We would also ask that you try to make appointments outside of school time.

Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day that honours the children who survived Indian Residential Schools and remembers those who did not. This day relates to the experience of Phyllis Webstad, a Northern Secwpemc (Shuswap) from the Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation, on her first day of school, where she arrived dressed in a new orange shirt, which was taken from her. It is now a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. Canadians are invited to wear an orange shirt to acknowledge the painful legacy of residential schools and the harm that Canada's residential school system continues to have on generations of Indigenous families and their communities. 




