#### 2. Principal's Report – Mr. Steve Rauh

- Reach out to Mr. Rauh anytime with questions or concerns: call or email
- Parent-Teacher Conferences- Will continue doing them online; Next week booking system will open up and we will use Microsoft Teams to meet with child's teachers; Proposing conferences to take place on **Nov 4 from 2:30-5:00**- Welcome to reach out to child's teacher at any time, not just during conferences
- XBlock- started 2 years ago as FIT block-, with the idea to give students extra prep, study time, and extra time to finish curricular assignments. Last year-introduced Xblock which is a much longer time-still instructional, but more flexible...This year is still a transition year: XBlock is 90 mins/2 times a week. Offers flexibilty, choice, time. Student support takes place during this time as well as 8 and 9 Careers Curriculum and district programs...math department created a math center during this time for students to go to for help and english and science departments are working to have places for kids to get extra help during Xblock. Also adding special curricular projects, such as gingerbread building in foods....You will see a lot of teachers offering extra opportunities...School will ask for feedback at the end of the year and Xblock will evolve to reflect what staff and students need during the school day.... (PE dept(hikes,zoomba)-fitness for life and fun)
- Remembrance Day-Nov 10 .. Will do recognition through staff video and class discussion
- Fall performing arts concert will happen on October 28 at 50% capacity requirement
- **Question**: During Xblock is child required to be on campus? **Answer**: No attendance is taken, but school is encouraging kids to stay during this time with with high interest activities
- Question: What are students learning in careers? Answer: Ministry of Education has curriculum documents for all subjects...you can read through them to get a sense of what is covered
- Question: How can people in academies use the Xblock opportunities? How to ensure 8 and 9s get careers content? Answer: Unfortunately students that are involved in district programs will not be involved in Xblock activities, career education is utilizing Google Classroom- This is perhaps a limitation and will bring concern to brainstorm solutions. Teachers are often available in the AM if schedule conflicts; Mr. Rauh will follow up with Diane Nelson to see how to best manage this concern.
