### 4. Graduation Assessments: April 26 & 28<sup>th</sup>

**April 26 & 28:** Students in grade 10, 11 or 12 writing the Literacy 10 / Literacy 12 Assessment this April should have received a memo in class or by email. Please see Ms. Tanfara if you have questions.

**Rewrites:** Any student wishing to re-write Literacy 12 this April, please see Ms. Kong in the main office.

**Prepare:** Students should prepare by doing the sample assessments prior writing to the assessment. Sample exams, videos and more information can be found here:
