4. DISSOLVE PERFORMANCE: Wed April 19th, 2023 at Rockridge – 7:00 pm

Written By Meghan Gardiner, Directed By Renée Iaci, and Starring Emmelia Gordon. Presented by West Vancouver Schools, North Vancouver School District, and Family Services of the North Shore. Wednesday, April 19, 7pm - Doors open at 6:30 pm.

Dissolve addresses the serious issues of sexual consent, drink spiking and drug-facilitated sexual assault from a darkly humorous perspective. Following a college girl on a night out, moving back and forth from home to bar scenes, one actress plays 16 characters, both comic and dramatic. Night turns to morning, and "Anygirl" awakens from her ordeal, disoriented. The show is designed to provoke thought and dialogue around drink spiking and consent, and challenge our thinking and behaviour surrounding these topics. The show is 45 minutes long and a talkback will follow the performance with Family Services of the North Shore Sexual Assault Response team.

Dissolve is best suited for mature adolescents and their accompanying caregivers due to sensitive content, and strong language. While there is no graphic visuals or descriptions, Dissolve does include references to gender-based violence, victim blaming, and drug facilitated sexual assault which may be upsetting to some viewers.

10. NEW Course: Computer Information Systems 12: Cybersecurity & Artificial Intelligence

Open to students from all three secondary schools, while priority is given to students entering Grade 12 in September, Grade 11s may also apply. Cybersecurity and Artificial Intelligence is a hybrid (in-person and virtual) course being offered by West Vancouver Schools. These areas of study impact many aspects of our lives today and demand for trained professionals in these areas is growing exponentially. Cybersecurity: In Canada, the unemployment rate for Cybersecurity professionals is 0%. In this course, students will learn about Digital Citizenship, Cybersecurity, Cybercrimes, Viruses, DDoS, Phishing, Cryptography, the Internet, how to stay safe online, and will also get Cybersafe certified. Students will also compete in CyberTitan (https://www.cybertitan.ca/) – one of Canada's

largest cyber defense competitions. Artificial Intelligence: We are impacted by AI every single day, as it includes self-driving cars that navigate roads independently, face filters in apps, healthcare for early detection and treatment, sports to maintain player fitness, agriculture for pest and disease control, and smart home assistants such as Alexa, Siri, and Cortana. Students will learn about Artificial Intelligence ethics, training data & bias, machine learning, neural networks, and computer vision. We will use some of Google's Artificial Intelligence software to gain a better understanding of how AI works and its applications.
