1. School Fees 2023-2024

The 2023/2024 School Course Fees are now available for payment on School Cash Online as of Monday, October 23rd. All school fees and field trips are added to this site and can be paid easily online with this website: https://westvancouver.schoolcashonline.com/. 2. Student Learning Updates and Family Portal Access

Parents will be able to access **Student Learning Updates** (formally report cards) on the MyEd family portal starting <u>tomorrow afternoon</u>, <u>Friday</u>, <u>October 27th</u>. This informal Learning Updates will provide a summary of each student's behavior, attendance, work habits, learning habits and/or engagement in each of their courses up to this point.

We will be offering the following routine Grade 9 vaccines to students this year:

- **Meningococcal vaccine:** A 4-strain meningococcal vaccine will be provided that protects against strains A, C, Y and W-135.
- Tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine: One dose boosts childhood immunity.

• **Catch up vaccines:** If needed for those missed at younger ages.

Optional Accident Insurance for Families
