

Post Secondary Admission

- Most institutions will require specific courses in grades 11 and 12
- Admission Average: Based on English 12 and at least 4 or 5 approved grade 12 courses
- Approved Courses: Every institution will have a list of required/recommended courses for admission

UBC Admission



UBC General Admission

Admission to UBC will be based on:

- Overall Academic Assessment: an <u>Overall Average</u> will be calculated based on academic Grade 11/12 courses
- Core Assessment: a <u>Core Average</u> will be calculated on program related courses
- 3. Key Courses: Pre-requisite courses and course specific minima (70% in English 11 or 12)
- Additional Considerations
 - 1. Breadth
 - 2. Rigour
