





UBC General Admission

Admission to UBC will be based on:

- Program Specific Aptitude: a <u>Core Average</u> will be calculated on program related courses
- 2. Personal Profile: short answers and activity list
- 3. Overall Academic Ability: an <u>Overall Average</u> will be calculated based on academic Grade 11/12 courses
- 4. Key Courses: pre-requisite courses and course specific minima. Depth and Breadth is considered

*** UBC now requires a 3 on the Literary Assessment 12

SFU General Admission

Admission requirements:

- 1. Minimum 5 approved grade 12s including English
- Overall average of approved courses at grade 11 and 12 will be considered
- 3. Minimum 70% in English 12
- 4. Each program has specific course requirements
