IB Diploma Programme Admission

- Fill out mandatory online application by **FEB 27, 3pm**
- Critical thinking test must be written if not currently in PDP
- Must write Short Writing Assessment. Last chance on **FEB 24, 3pm**
- May choose the IB Diploma or up to 3 IB classes

- Students may select up to 3 IB HL courses at course planning
- Students must have written the IB test or currently be taking a PDP course
- Full diploma students will get priority enrollment. IB Course students will be placed depending upon space.

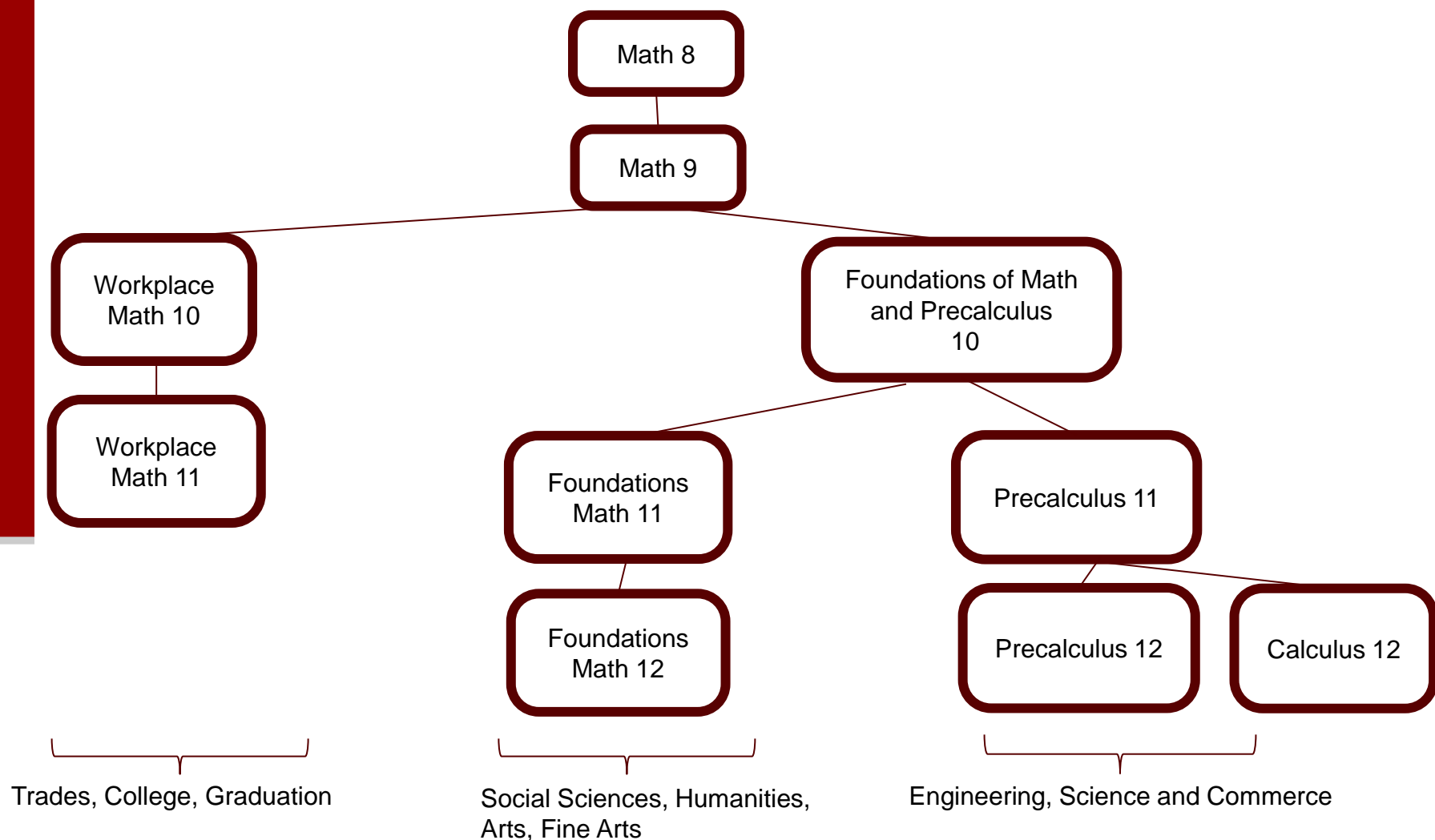



Career Life Connections 12A

- 12A – 2 credits in grade 11, 12B - 2 credits in grade 12
- Experiential Learning: 30 hours of work experience or community service.
- Transition Planning: Post-secondary and career preparation
- Approximately 2 classes per month
- Capstone Project
- Format: this class will meet outside of the regular timetable. It is in addition to the 8 classes taken.

Career Programs

- 90 hours of volunteer or paid work / 30 hours in class

WVSS Youth Train in Trades Carpentry Program (16 credits)

UBC General Admission

Admission to UBC will be based on:

1. Program Specific Aptitude: a Core Average will be calculated on program related courses
2. Personal Profile: short answers and activity list
3. Overall Academic Ability: an Overall Average will be calculated based on academic Grade 11/12 courses
4. Key Courses: pre-requisite courses and course specific minima. Depth and Breadth is considered. For example: English 11 or 12 at 70%.

*** UBC now requires a 3 on the Literary Assessment 12

SFU General Admission

Admission requirements:

1. Minimum 5 approved grade 12s including English
2. Overall average of approved courses at grade 11 and 12 will be considered
3. Minimum 70% in English 11-12
4. Each program has specific course requirements

Password Blank:

Temporary Password Given:

- Log in with temporary password – case sensitive
- Will need to immediately create a new password
- Password must meet security requirements Example: Grad#2025
- Password can't contain any login info
- Password must be reset every 3 months

How to Enter Classes in MyEd

1. Log into My Education BC
2. Go to **MY INFO** tab in the left corner
3. Choose **REQUESTS** in left column
4. Input course selection
5. When finished select **POST** in bottom left corner
6. Hand in course selection sheet with **ALTERNATES** filled in
