Terminology

Certificate: 1 year program at college which provides specific training (BCIT, Langara, Cap)

Diploma: 2 year program at college which provides more intensive specific training (BCIT, Langara, Cap)

Degree: 4 year academic and theoretical program (UBC, SFU, UVic, Cap U, BCIT)

University Transfer: program designed for student to transfer to bigger institution (Cap, Langara to UBC, SFU)

Post Secondary Admission


- ▶ Most institutions will require specific courses in grades 11 and 12
- ▶ **Admission Average:** Based on English 12 and at least 4 or 5 approved courses
- ▶ **Approved Courses:** Every institution will have a list of courses they accept for admission (except UBC and U of T)
- ▶ **English Language Competency:** 3 or 4 consecutive years studying in English are required, otherwise IELTS, Toefl etc.

UBC General Admission

Admission to UBC will be based on:

1. Program Specific Aptitude: a Core Average will be calculated on program related courses
2. Personal Profile: short answers and activity list
3. Overall Academic Ability: an Overall Average will be calculated based on academic Grade 11/12 courses
4. Key Courses: Pre-requisite courses and course specific minima. Depth and breadth. (70% in English 11 or 12 minimum)
5. UBC requires a 3 on the Literacy 12 Assessment

UBC Admission



SFU General Admission

Admission to SFU will be based on

1. Minimum 5 approved grade 12s including English
2. Minimum 70% in English 12 and 60% in Math 11 for admission
3. Each program has specific course requirements at grade 11 and 12

My Education BC Login

Password Blank:

You have set up an account and can log in. May need to reset password.

Temporary Password Given:

- Log in with temporary password – case sensitive
- Will need to immediately create a new password
- Password must meet security requirements

Example: Grad#2025

- Password can't contain any login info
- Password must be reset every 3 months

How to Enter Classes in MyEd

1. Log into My Education BC
2. Go to **MY INFO** tab in the left corner
3. Choose **REQUESTS** in left column
4. Input course selection
5. When finished select **POST** in bottom left corner
6. Hand in course selection sheet with **ALTERNATES** filled in
