

• The original track at West Vancouver Secondary School (WVSS)

• The track was replaced in 1990 on a cost sharing basis between the District, West Vancouver Schools (WVS), and the Province.

• The District's 2011 Sports Field Master Plan identified a need for

• Combining a new track with an artificial turf field supports the needs of the school students, sports academies, athletic organizations, sports groups, and the recreational needs of the greater community.

• Olympic athlete, Harry Jerome, used to train on the WVSS track

• WVS and the District have been working together on this project

PROCESS TO DATE

- **2011** The Sports Field Master Plan identifies a need for a new artifical field and recommends WVSS
- **2013** The District and WVS undertake a feasibility study to replace the track and sports field
- **2014** Place for Sport community consultation on the project with stakeholders and the community takes place
- **2015** > Project scope is created and the School Board passes a motion to support the project > Traffic and lighting studies are completed
 - > Fundraising committee is created
- **2016–2019** Major fundraising campaign is launched by the West Vancouver Foundation
 - **2020** Design and tender drawings are created
 - **2021** Future track is named the Harry Jerome Oval, and geotechnical work is completed
 - **2022** Project drawings are completed
 - **2023** > Council votes to expand the scope of the project to include a six-lane track, artificial turf field with lighting, and renovation of WVSS washrooms > Place for Sport funding is secured

PROJECT SCOPE

WEST VANCOUVER PLACE EOR SPORT

• Six-lane track with sandwich system track surface (designed for traction and shock absorption)

Artificial turf field 64 m x 116 m with sports field lighting

 Long jump, high jump, triple jump, pole vault, shotput, training areas for discus, hammer, and javelin

 Renovated washrooms in WVSS which will be accessible to the community outside of school hours





PROJECT TIMELINE

November 2023

- Site preparation begins

December 2023 to Summer 2024

- Excavation and construction work
- Retaining walls, leveling, etc.

Summer 2024 to Winter 2025

Installation of the track and the artifical field

Winter 2025

Place for Sport is completed

- Safety is a top priority.

PLACE FOR SPORT: LIGHTING

 Specialized lighting will maximize time available at the facility and maintain a safe facility for the community.

 Lighting will include four pole-mounted LED lights that will provide high performance uniform lighting for the track and field programs with maximum control over spill and glare to minimize the impact to neighbours.
