Chartwell Garden

Our Community Grant application is ready to submit. We are applying for a grant of \$10,000 to be used in conjunction with our budgeted amount of \$3,000 for a school garden and the same amount to be given from Sentinel. Our initiative name is 'The Garden Hub' which will connect Chartwell, Sentinel and the Properties Hub through the creation and maintenance of 2 gardens; a garden celebrating and explaining Indigenous plants & their uses, and a garden of raised beds to grow, harvest and share vegetables. With this sort of grant, it is necessary for the PAC to 'partner' with the School District since they are the registered charity and will need to be the recipient of the funds. (Chartwell PAC does not have its own charitable number). As the project falls within the guidelines and policies of the district they have given us the go ahead to proceed. The Grants Committee will meet to recommend grants for approval by the Board of Directors. By mid-March 2020, we will receive an email notifying us if the grant request was approved. Regardless if we get the grant we are going forward with the raised garden. Facilities will let us use their equipment. 12 raised beds, goal is so that they can be moved if need be. Possible self-watering raised beds and/or use of rain barrels. The garden will be much better if we get the grant, but we will do the project with the \$6000 that we have allocated for this.

Traffic Safety

Our Traffic Safety Initiative has started now that the appropriate signage and road markings are in place. Volunteer spots have been set up for the next couple of weeks, for the first 2 weeks after Spring Break and again mid- May. Volunteers are asked to assist children in crossing to the sidewalk as well as directing them to the end of the loop for pickup and to assist children in crossing Chartwell Drive in both directions. It is not the responsibility of the parent volunteers to direct traffic (vehicles) or verbally engage with drivers. Please sign up for a spot if you can - it is just a half an hour commitment.

School – Wide Activities and Events:

- Collaboration funds to assist teachers in writing strategies \$2100. This is part of the FESL project.

 - Still researching technology (Little Bits, Osmo) In consultation with staff
- Indigenous Education Plan (storytelling and drum making workshops in April) \$2500 plus \$1500 left over from last year.
- Physical Literacy: Field Hockey (free sessions plus \$350) looking to add new programs such as Ultimate and Karate.
- Digital Literacy: Tinkercad – looking to do it again this year, students loved it last year.

The Garden Hub at Chartwell and Sentinel – Thank you CPAC for submitting a grant application to West Vancouver Community Foundations

Physical Literacy is motivation, confidence, physical competence, knowledge and understanding to value and take responsibility for engagement in physical activities for life.

Chartwell students are vulnerable in their acquisition and implementation of basic physical literacy skills. Our students need to have better physical literacy.

- *How do we incorporate it into regular curriculum?*
 - Movement Mondays, Workout Wednesdays, Follow-up Fridays to encourage kids to discuss with parents because it should not end at school
 - 6 - week strength training for everyone, build on it every week for 6 weeks and let the students see their progress at the end.
 - 3 times per week = Stronger, healthier and smarter kids
 - West Van 5k Run March 7 – kids 13 and under can run 1k to be part of the race for free

Question: Are the Amber and Erin the same ladies doing the measurement of our students' assessment? Was there a follow up from last year and do we know the progress?

Answer: We don't have the statistics for last year, but this is something the teachers can work to incorporate in everyday curriculum.

Question: How did they look at the kid's physical literacy competence?

Answer: Physical capabilities did not meet what the other kids in district can do.

Nessa made the comment that it could be the connection between what the skill is called and what it is vs. actually being able to do it.

Playground enhancement will include a variety of physical literacy skills.

Question: Will the Code of Conduct replace the RRR?

Answer: Not necessarily they may just be couched in a different way. If we value these rights, how do we incorporate them in the Code of Conduct.

MOE Playground Equipment Program

- Applied for every year, usually awarded every 3 years
- Around 90-110k – District usually designates one school that gets the bulk of that grant. It was last awarded March 2018. Chartwell is #1 on the list and may receive the go ahead as of March of this year.
- Facilities role is to get rid of the equipment then we have a Habitat design and install. [Habitat Website](#)
- If awarded to Chartwell, we should have a project designed and quoted for installation over the summer

Question: Has the district gotten back to us about if our equipment is at end of life?

Answer: No they did not, but were told when we do get the grant we should be ready There is a 5k grant for improvement but is just a drop in the bucket for what we need.

Nessa: We can apply through gaming grant for playground \$ as well. In request if we emphasize that it needs to be more accessible, we may get the grant. It's a matching funds grant, so they would match what we have. Max is \$250k in matching funds.

Laura: Does it have to be PAC funds that they are matching?

Nessa: I'm not 100% percent sure, but the application would come from the Pac
Deadline: June- July to apply

What are some of the new playground ideas?

We are 2nd lowest in accessibility in the district. We have wood chips and a ledge that is not accessible. Where will they go and how they will interact with other children with accessibility aids. We need to quickly move forward with playground committees to have some definitive ideas.

We want to utilize the community and student vote to make some of the decisions. This would be a great way to involve the individuals that will be using it. We need to create a committee and do some site visits to other places to see what some other places have done. Can be online, but physically doing it gives more insight.

Tamzyn has already reached out to Habitat to start scheduling Lunch and Learns and informational meetings.

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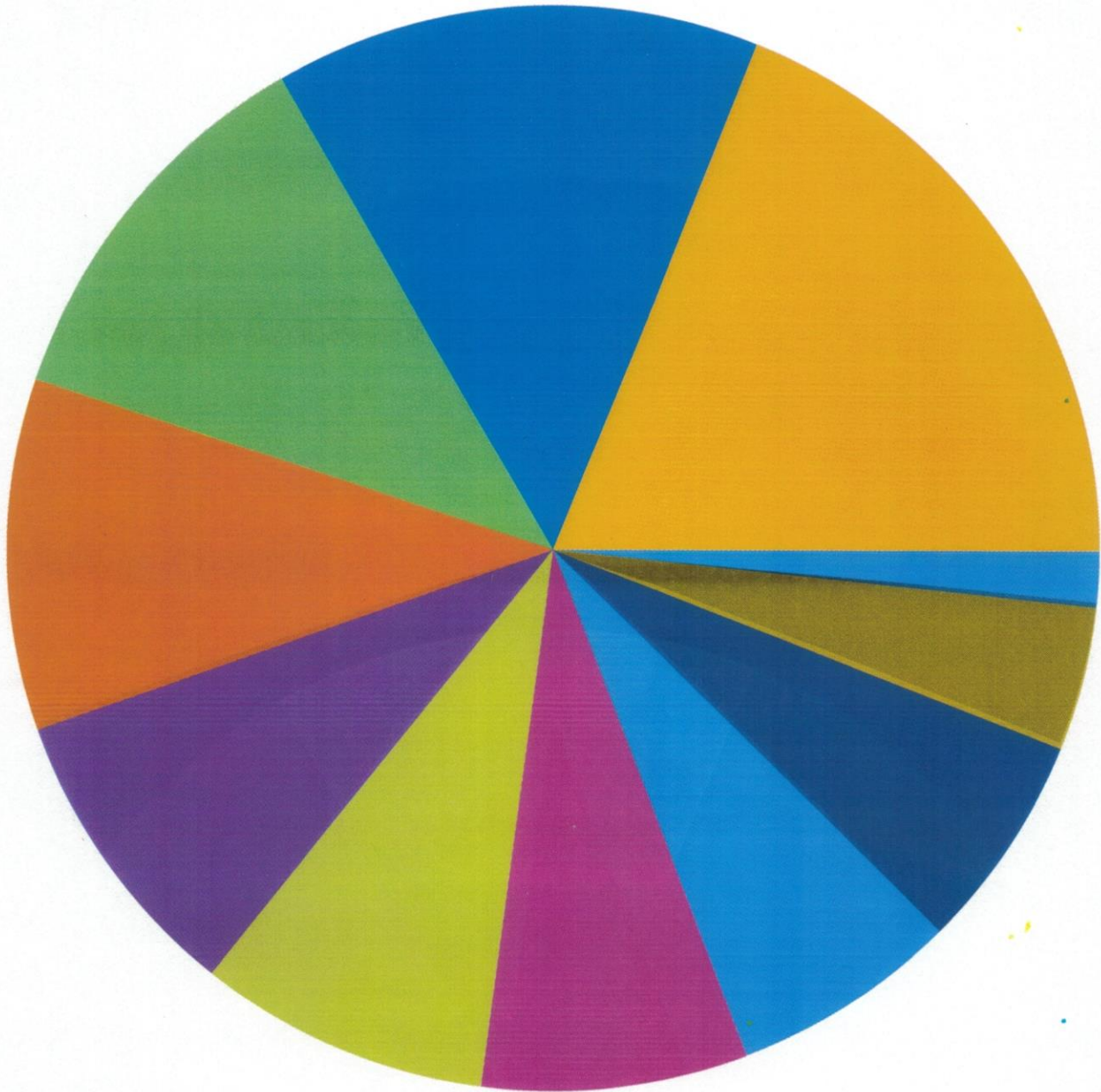
